Marvellous Me: Celebrating Uniqueness

For the autumn term, each month has its own learning theme tailored to the areas of development most relevant for each age group. In September, our focus will be Marvellous Me:

Celebrating Uniqueness.

Marvellous Me is a celebration of everything that makes each child special. It's a wonderful way for us to get to know children and families deeply, building a secure foundation from which every child can grow and thrive.

Cubs Room

In the **Cubs** Room, we help our youngest learners begin to explore who they are, what they can do, and the special people in their lives through:

- Exploring faces and voices recognising familiar people and responding to smiles, sounds, and gentle conversation.
- Discovering their bodies finding hands and feet, learning to roll, sit, crawl, and perhaps take first steps.
- Building early communication babbling, copying sounds, using gestures, and enjoying songs and rhymes.
- Developing strong bonds feeling safe and loved through caring relationships with key adults.
- Enjoying sensory play exploring textures, sounds, and colours to spark curiosity and learning.





Marvellous Me: Celebrating Uniqueness

Bears Room

For our **Bears**, Marvellous Me is about helping children discover more about themselves, their abilities, and the special people in their lives. At this age, children are full of curiosity, independence, and personality, and we nurture this through:





- Learning about our bodies

<u>Tigers, Leopards & Lions Room</u>

In our **Tigers, Leopards & Lions** rooms, Marvellous Me helps children explore their identities, talents, and relationships while building the skills they'll need for school:

- Our bodies learning how they work and how to
 keep them healthy.
- Our families and friends talking about who is special to us and celebrating differences and similarities.
- Our feelings recognising emotions, expressing them
 positively, and problem-solving with
 kindness.
- Our talents and interests –
 discovering what we enjoy and what
 makes us proud.







October: Autumnal Senses

This month, all our rooms are embracing the beauty of autumn through a sensory adventure. By exploring the sights, sounds, smells, textures, and tastes of the season, children will connect with nature, build curiosity, and develop skills across all areas of learning.

This theme is not just about noticing the season, it's about engaging the senses, sparking curiosity, and building a stronger connection with the natural world.



Cubs Room

In the **Cubs** Room, **Autumnal Senses** will be explored through gentle, age-appropriate experiences that allow our youngest learners to safely enjoy seasonal changes:

- Sight looking at colourful autumn leaves, pumpkins, and natural treasures in discovery baskets.
- Hearing listening to rustling leaves and environmental sounds during trips to the park.
- Smell exploring scents such as cinnamon sticks, oranges, and pinecones.
- Touch feeling natural items like leaves, smooth conkers, and soft scarves.
- Taste trying pumpkin and apple purées (where appropriate).

October: Autumnal Senses

Bears Room

For our **Bears**, autumn brings opportunities to discover, explore, and talk about what they notice:

- Sight recognising the colours of leaves on nature walks, looking closely at pumpkins, exploring woodland animals, and commenting on what they see.
- Hearing enjoying seasonal stories, the wind in the trees, and crunchy leaves underfoot.
- Touch handling pinecones, conkers, and leaves in sensory trays and craft activities.
- **Smell** enjoying scents like cinnamon, apple, and nutmeg during playdough and sensory play.
- Taste sampling autumnal foods such as roasted vegetables or apple slices (where appropriate).



<u>Tigers, Leopards & Lions Room</u>

In our **Tigers, Leopards, Lions** rooms, **Autumnal Senses** will encourage deeper exploration of seasonal changes while developing descriptive language, early science skills, and creativity:

- Sight observing how leaves change colour, spotting acorns and berries, and noticing how the days get shorter.
- Hearing listening to rustling leaves, snapping twigs, and autumn poems and songs.
- Touch handling pinecones, bark, and leaves, and using them
 in art and construction projects.
- Smell exploring the aromas of seasonal fruits, herbs, and spices like cinnamon and cloves.
- Taste enjoying warming autumn foods such as vegetable soup, apple slices, or pumpkin bread.

November: Sparkle and Shine

Cubs and Bears Room

The sparkle and shine theme is important for babies and young children because it blends joyful sensory experiences with early developmental support. Gentle lights and twinkles capture their attention and strengthen their visual tracking, while shiny shapes introduce them to the world of patterns, contrasts and early spatial awareness. Playful moments filled with giggles nurture emotional bonding and teaches our youngest children that learning is playful and fun, warm encouragement paired with opportunities to move, builds their confidence and motor skills. Together, these elements create a stimulating, loving environment that supports brain growth, physical coordination and emotional well-being in a way that feels magical for both cubs babies and bears children.



Tigers, Leopards and Lions Room

At our nursery, we believe **kindness** is a core value that we want all our children to hold, from our youngest babies to our oldest children. The theme **sparkle and shine** will celebrate the kindness and care the children have for one another and for our world in the Tigers, Leopards and Lions rooms. We will encourage our children to 'shine a light' on people who help us, for example people in our family, friends, helpers at our nursery and in the wider community – we will teach this through story books, activities focused on this topic and through play. We will explore how small acts like **sharing**, using our manners and looking after the world around us can make a big difference, teaching children that small acts of kindness are little sparks, and together, these sparks will 'sparkle' our world, making it a brighter, happier place for everyone.

December: Creator's Club

Creativity is a core concept we value in our nursery because we believe it helps build the skills children need for life. When children engage in open ended imaginative activities they learn to **problem solve** and **think flexibly** whilst expressing their own ideas in unique ways.

Cubs and Bears Room

- Shape tap and tinkle invites the cubs and bears to explore colourful shapes they can tap, stack and shake, discovering new sounds and textures with every touch.
- Build and bash encourages our smallest architects to stack soft blocks high, then joyfully topple them downlearning cause and effect while practicing their motor skills, the bears children will extend cause and effect learning in other ways.
- Rainbow wiggles is all about movement and colour, with flowing scarves, ribbons and soft arches that encourage children to reach, wiggle and crawl through a world of rainbows. Every activity blends sensory discovery with giggles, giving babies and young children a safe space to explore, create and grow.





December: Creator's Club

Tigers, Leopards and Lions Room

For Tigers, Leopards and Lions children creative play develops hand-eye coordination and enhances focus and perseverance; this also supports encouraging our children to have a go and take risks. It develops confidence as they make their own choices and ignites the love for learning; turning curiosity into a lifelong habit and supports children to view themselves as capable, inventive thinkers.

- Little Makers, Big Imagination encourages children to bring their big ideas to life to life. Each week is filled with hands-on adventures that inspire curiosity and confidence.
- In Pattern Play, children discover shapes, colours, and sequences through puzzles, stamping, and playful sorting games.
- Our Little Artists explore paint, collage, and clay, learning to express their ideas in vibrant, tactile ways.
